by Scott R. Welvaert

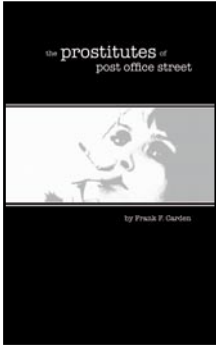

by John Davis

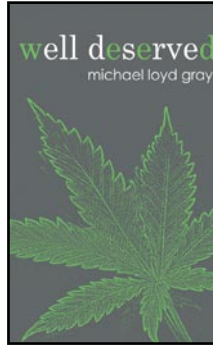

by Frank F. Carden

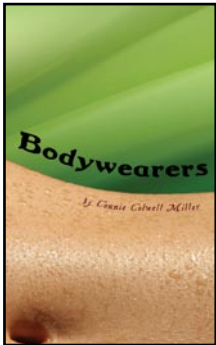
